Absent:

- Beth turned in her key to the room at the town hall where the Historian records are stored
- Stated that she showed Jaymie Closson the records and showed what belongs to the town and what belongs to the historical society

District Attorney, Mark Suben

- Started by stating that he likes to get out to the towns once a year to report on criminal justice
- Statistically right now crime is down. He is dealing with 5 cases of homicide right now
- Cortland County was number one in New York State for meth lab arrests for a little while. There is still a lot of heroin, cocaine and pills around
- There is a county law on buying Sudafed, but he feels it should be a State law
- He started a Drug Treatment Court. There are people that are addicted and commit other crimes, he is
 trying to give people a chance so that a felony is not on their record forever, but some people take
 advantage of the program
- He will not let meth addicts in to this program. Feels it is a waste of tax payers money
- He is promoting a Child Advocacy Center in Cortland
 - Investigating into child sexual abuse cases
 - A multi-disciplinary team instead of all interviewing the child separately
 - Closed circuit monitoring, all interview once instead of re-victimizing the child, very child friendly
 - Was about to lose the ability to use this facility about 3 years ago when he was approached to take over this. It won't work without the cops participation
 - This is all state funding. They received a \$76,000 grant
 - In 3 years it is now Tier 1 which is the top in the state, grant is close to \$130,000.00 a year
 - Not for profit agency is now formed, as the D.A. he cannot raise money for this
 - Nationally Accredited Center
- Just lost his Chief Assistant to a higher paying job, happens when hiring good talent
- Will not hire anyone that he feels cannot do the job according to he believes as well as they can

Was asked what his outlook is on Court Consolidation?

Inevitable and a good thing, but not for him to tell people what to do, but feels it's the right thing to do

- State is running out money so it is slowly moving in that direction
- Small towns might have to eventually do this, it may be the future
